Since our last meeting in the fall, we have reviewed the operations, examined the University's financial reports, and actively listened to members of our constituencies. In October, we put a plan in place – in collaboration with University leaders, to move this institution forward and address the challenges and opportunities ahead. Later this month, we will share more details of that strategic plan.

As a sign of the strength and stability of Oakwood University, on December 6, 2023, the 77 members of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) Board of Directors, on behalf of the US Department of Education voted the full 10-year institutional accreditation to the University through to 2032.

Each Oakwood University Trustee is passionate and committed to the success of our students and our institution. We ask all to keep us in your prayers.

### **Oakwood University Success**

Oakwood University, founded in 1896, stands as a distinguished historically black university with a rich legacy of achievements in various domains.

Notably, the Nursing Department achieved a remarkable 100% pass rate on the National Council Licensure Examination, signaling a triumphant resurgence for the program. In the last ten years, the university has

experienced significant growth in diversity, witnessing a remarkable 150% increase in the Latino student population and over 500% rise in

Continental African students in the last five years. Renowned for its musical

excellence, Oakwood's Aeolians choir is set to benefit from department renovations funded by external sources. The university's musical legacy

extends to numerous alumni nominated for Grammy Awards, including legends like Little Richard and 10-time Grammy winners Take 6.

Beyond accolades, Oakwood actively supports students through

scholarships, with more than 60 awarded at the Honors Convocation 2022.

Securing substantial grants, including a \$1 million award from the United Negro College Fund and nearly \$1 million from the Lilly Endowment, Oakwood University continues to enhance enrollment processes and fund unique academic programs.

Additionally, the university's inclusion in the Second Chance Pell Experiment demonstrates its commitment to providing educational opportunities for incarcerated individuals. Oakwood Live 2023 attracted a record 950 registrants, including 700 high school students, while faculty retention remains high at 96%. This snapshot highlights Oakwood University's dynamic growth, academic excellence, and commitment to diversity and social impact over the past decade.

### **Fundraising**

Oakwood University's fundraising efforts are yielding positive results. Despite the national trend of flat or declining levels of philanthropic support for non-profit organizations (Giving USA, May 2023), the Office of University Advancement reports that in the calendar year 2023, we raised - \$2,432,606 (which is a 32% increase over 2022) from 1616 donors (which is a 33% increase over 2022.) As we head into the remainder of the academic and fiscal year, we plan to build on that increase, especially as it relates to supporting student scholarships.

### **Communications**

The Board of Trustees is committed to increasing communication with the Oakwood community more widely.
